
FIXING INSTRUCTIONS


STANDARD RECTANGULAR BATH (WOOD FRAME)



To assemble and install the bath read carefully through the step-by-step instructions first, then follow them throughout the assembly.


Check all parts against the parts list before discarding any of the packaging. Remove all protection from bath and check surface for damage or defects as no responsibility can be accepted for obvious defects after installation.

Make sure that the area in which you will be working is free from any objects that may scratch the bath as for some stages it will have to be face down. It is a good idea to lay down a large sheet of cardboard first.



- **a** Lay the bath upside down on its face while the packaging is still intact.
- **b** Remove the leg sets, box of fittings and grip pack from the underside of the bath. Any screws removed to take the components off should be kept as they will be needed later.




a Use table to find the leg positions for your bath.

Bath	×	Y
Jupiter	350	370
Nocturne 1700	370	350
Nocturne 1500	380	. 325
Ascana	400	340

All others	400	400


- **b** Mark distances X and Y onto the wood top frame.
- Place leg set over bath at positions marked and fix to baseboard with Part No. 5.




a Secure the sockets to the timber frame using the 1/2" self tapping screws Part No. 5.

Then align the holes in the leg with the slots, pass self tapping screw (Part No. 5) through the hole that is visible and then secure.



- Assemble fifth foot by screwing M8 nut (Part No. 3) onto foot (Part No. 2) than placing through bracket (Part No. 4) and securing with M8 nut. Then secure in position shown using 2 screws (Part No. 5).
- Assemble the other four feet onto the legs by placing one M8 nut (Part No. 3) onto the foot then the bridge washer (Part No. 8) then through the leg and secure with M8 nut.
- C Screw wall bracket
 (Part No. 7) to wood
 frame using screws
 (Part No. 5).
 Preferably along back
 edge of bath.



For pillar type grips
Place pillar into grip,
using allen key tighten
grub screw so that pillar

grub screw so that pillar cannot fall out, but is still loose (2 per grip).






offer grip holes in bath and tighten, using rubber washer, then steel and finally M8 nut. Tighten grub screw in grip (see 5a) to secure grip to pillar.


NB: Grub screws to face downwards.

C For alternative grips
Assemble as shown.
NB: Certain models
may have a stud and
nut instead of a bolt.







- Place bath in position and set the bath to the required height using adjustable feet, bearing in mind the type and height of panel to be fitted (check height in panel Fixing Instructions). Check that the bath is level using a large spirit level.
- **b** Once satisfied with the level and height of the bath, mark around the wall brackets and their holes, lock feet at height set using M8 nuts. Then adjust 5th foot to contact floor and lock using M8 nuts.



- Remove the bath from against the wall and drill two holes in the position marked suitable for No. 10 wall plugs (No. 10 masonry bit).
- **b** Remove plaster around the hole to the line marked around the bracket, to allow a flush fit of the bath to the wall.

- Re-position the bath against the wall and check the level before marking any plumbing connections. Fix the taps and the waste to the bath. Check for leaks.
- **b** Using No. 10 wall plugs (not supplied) fix the bath to the wall using screws (Part No. 6).
- **c** Screw the two outer feet to the floor screws not supplied.

CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Wipe around the bath after each use and rinse with cold water. Most soiling can easily be removed by using a non-abrasive cleaner. DO NOT use scouring powders, which are not necessary and cause damage.

Hair lacquer, nail lacquer or nail lacquer remover, paint strippers and some dry cleaning agents will damage the surface. Obviously a naked flame or lighted cigarette should not be allowed to come into contact as these will mark the surface (in SOME cases these burns can be removed by GENTLY rubbing with an abrasive surface such as a VERY FINE emery paper, and the surface repolished with a metal polish).
